There were no problems nor any surprises with the Underwood-barreled carbine. It's a decent representative example of the M1 carbine.



CMP-2 INLAND CARBINE 30 US CARBINE, \$495

This was our first choice, in part because of its low price. During testing, we noted the Inland-barreled version sold out. Now we see why.

The M1 carbine began life with a round bolt (left), but later production gave it a flattened top (right). We preferred the look of the rounded one, but many shooters like the other. They work equally well, we found.



Three of our carbines had milled trigger guards, left. Only the Underwood had a stamped, welded guard, right. Note also the two types of safety, the rotating lever, shown in the milled guard, and the shotgun-style push-button.



The two CMP carbines had a stamped base for the rear sight. While it has most of the adjustments of the milled version, it lacks the ability to reset the windage zero.
